Basics:

Environment sub-programme

- Nature & biodiversity: conservation projects
- All other environmental sectors: environment and resource efficiency – air, chemicals, green & circular economy, marine and coastal management, soil, waste, water, and the urban environment; especially technologies & solutions
- Governance & information: awareness raising, environmental training and capacity building, legislative compliance and enforcement, knowledge development and public and stakeholder participation

Climate action sub-programme

- Climate change mitigation: renewable energies, energy efficiency, farming, land use, and peatland management.
- Climate change adaptation: resilience to water scarcity, droughts, forest fires or floods, adaptive technologies for economic sectors, and safeguarding natural resources.
- Climate governance and information: awareness raising, training and capacity building, law compliance and enforcement, knowledge development and stakeholder participation

What kind of projects?

- Traditional projects, capacity building, Technical assistance and integrated projects (to implement certain plans and strategies), preparatory projects (addressing specific needs for implementation of EU law), NGO grants, financial instruments, preparatory projects
- Average size and duration: no limits, you decide! Whatever fits your projects best, total flexibility
- Attention, LIFE offers only co-financing, ~55% up to 75% (conservation)

Novelties of this call 2020:

- Covid-measures (deadline extended, pre-financing increased, flexibility measures)
- For the very first time: bilateral chats to discuss about project proposals
- Financial support to third parties (non-profit organizations, local authorities or citizen groups)
- Support to start-ups; limits the financial risk also for SMEs
- Private land conservation by engagement of private owners (not buying the land!)

- Invertebrates: EU pollinators initiative (promoting crop diversity, alternative use of pesticides, data collection and monitoring of pollinators)
- EU and IUCN red list species (that are NOT listed in the Habitat's directive)
- Reduced reporting
- Reduced monitoring
- Reduced auditing
- No VAT certificate required
- 2-stages-approach

Tips for a successful proposal (Fabio Leone)

Good preparation is essential, chances from concept to project stage is only ~15% (max 20%), then 40-50% of these get actual financing

Take care of your design:

Good design

Solid analysis of the problem, state of play and solution proposed (baseline)

Key stakeholders involved (incl. users)

Robust assessment of impacts over the life cycle of the solution proposed

Clear strategy on how to sustain and multiply the impacts

Common problems

Insufficient background information (why, who and how)

Rationale for projects is defined during the project

Objectives too broad, too many

Poor partnership (partners don't fit regarding know-how or insufficient budget)

Over-optimistic / unrealistic or lack of quantification of impacts

Replication confused with networking and dissemination

Vague plans to sustain the project/results after project end
